



The Elric Johnston Endersby Internship in Public History

The Historical Society of Princeton seeks applicants for the Elric Johnston Endersby Internship, a paid, hands-on opportunity for students and emerging professionals interested in public history.

Description:

Established in memory of Elric Endersby, this internship is designed to introduce participants to the practical realities of working at museums and community history organizations, helping them see how a love of history can become a career. Depending on interests and institutional needs, projects may include working with historical collections, supporting oral history initiatives, assisting with research and interpretation, or contributing to public-facing programs and exhibitions. Interns will work alongside HSP staff, gain exposure to the day-to-day workings of a community-based history organization, and develop skills relevant to careers in history, museums, archives, and related fields.

Compensation and Schedule:

This is a paid summer internship at \$17 per hour for up to 200 total hours. A regular weekly schedule will be agreed upon at the beginning of the internship, taking the intern's availability into account.

Eligibility:

Undergraduate or graduate students, recent graduates, and emerging professionals with a demonstrated interest in history. Previous museum or archival experience is not required.

Requirements:

As there is no public transportation to our site, access to a car is required.
